# The Wastewater Treatment Process

Every time we turn on the faucet or flush our toilets, water drains away. So where does it go and what happens to it? To simply dump wastewater into the Caribbean Sea would be both illegal and extremely harmful to the living organisms that surround this island. So, wastewater from Coakley Bay undergoes a treatment process to render it safe and to avoid contamination of our beautiful island and the sea that surrounds it.

There are distinct stages in this process, each heavily reliant on the previous stage, so it's **extremely important** to ensure that nothing which can knock out any stage is allowed to enter this process.

The first stage is getting the wastewater from the drain to the treatment plant. The treatment plant is located above the level of the initial outflow of wastewater, so it has to be "lifted" (pumped up) a gradient. This is accomplished at two **Lift Stations.** The pumps there also grind larger matter down to matter that can be accommodated further down the line. This is the first stage that can be knocked out. Very large items that should never enter the system can defeat the grinders and stop the pumps. Also something like grease can coagulate, form lumps, and knock out this stage.

From the Lift Stations, the waste water goes to the **Treatment Plant**. The treatment plant has both mechanical and biological means to deal with the incoming wastewater. Firstly, the wastewater is held in a tank to enable large solids to settle out, then to another holding tank to enable finer particles to also settle out. The settled solids are termed Raw Sludge. Grease and oils float on the surface and are skimmed off.

The next stage is the **Biological Stage**. Although the mechanical stage is fairly effective at separating larger particulate matter, dissolved solids require something else. The effluent is passed into an aeration tank. Here the water is vigorously stirred and oxygen added. The microorganisms multiply in the presence of both the nutrients in the effluent and the increase in oxygen. It is an equation really. Organic matter + microbes + oxygen gives out more microbes + carbon dioxide + water. At the end of the aeration period, the mixture is passed into a settling tank where the masses of bacteria are allowed to settle. The treated waste water is then used for irrigation and flushing or passed back into the grey water system for reuse after chlorination.

To maintain this control of this process is a constant task for our staff, and also for you as owners. The process can be stopped completely if the bacteria expire as a result of the wrong things enter the system. The basic rule of thumb is, don't flush anything other than toilet paper and human waste. Do not put anything into the system that will kill the microbes we so heavily depend upon. Clorox, detergents, solvents, and harsh chemicals are microbial killers.
